Poukawa School is now under COVID-19 Alert Level 2. We are still open and students can continue to attend. We are going back to our strict hygiene protocols and contact tracing. Sick or unwell children must not be sent to school.

Absolutely no one is to enter the school ground before 8am. Adam or Paul will open the gate to allow children to enter. You will have to go to the office and fill in a contact tracing form if you enter school with your child..

Children and parents in Kereru Class

Please use the Bus Bay gate and walk your child around to the front door of Kereru class. Shirley will have contact tracing forms with her for you to fill out. After school use the same gate for entering and exiting the school. Please do not park your car in the bus bay.

Parents picking up children

Please call the school, 06-874-8880. Staff members will organise the children to go down to the main gate, exit the school and move towards their parent/caregiver's vehicle. Take care and walk on the side of the road watching out for other road users.

Bus

The bus will be doing its normal run. Buses pick up times in the morning and the afternoon drop offs are the same too. Children will be hand sanitising before they get onto the bus in the morning and will wash their hands before they come home in the afternoon.

We are enforcing strict personal hygiene routines for children and the staff at Poukawa School. Make sure the last thing they do before leaving the house for school is to wash their hands.

If your child is feeling unwell, is sick or has flu-like symptoms (cough, sore throat, temperature or run nose). **DO NOT SEND THEM TO SCHOOL!** If a child turns up at school with any of these symptoms, parents and caregivers will be contacted to pick up their child. Please do not send your child back to school until they are fully recovered.

BUS RUNS

Please do not ask for your child to change bus runs unless the circumstances are exceptional. Under Covid Alert Level 2 changes will not be allowed.
